Sampoojya Bhoomananda Theerthapada Swamikal of Theerthapadasramam, Vazhoor gave a talk on the science and philosophy behind the ancient system of yoga. In the speech it was said that yoga is a comprehensive holistic system for the harmonic all round development



of man. Swamiji called upon the students to reap the benefits of yoga through regular practice.

The talk was followed by a yoga training session by Yoga Pramukh Smt. Sreeja M P in which proper breathing techniques were explained and common asanas demonstrated. The yoga session helped the students and teachers experience deep relaxation of body and mind. They also learned a set of yoga postures that even a person with busy schedule can do daily in a short time. Over 300 students and 10 teachers participated.

The entire manual works relating to the digging of the pit and erecting a shed for the same, were done by the volunteers and the Programme officers.

JULY 1-15 PLANTATION OF TREES

As part of nurturing the trees in the campus the NSS volunteers tended the ebony-tree saplings planted in the college campus as part of the green campus clean campus initiative of the NSS Unit in association with the Forest Division, Kottayam on October 2018. Protective fences were erected for 35 saplings and the work on the rest of the





saplings is continuing.

Thirty seven volunteers planted saplings of various indigenous trees like mango, jack fruit at their homes and they furnished the details of saplings planted and their assurance that they will nurture the plants.

AUGUST 1-15, SUCHITWA PAKVADA
